FLOWER SHOW & OTHER AGM COMPETITIONS

JUDGING

- Decisions made by the Judge(s) will be based upon the guidelines included in the Ontario Judging and Exhibiting Standards for Horticulture and Floral Design 2003 (OJES) in conjunction with any criteria included in the Show Schedule specific to the Division/Class. <u>Criteria stated in the Show</u> Schedule take precedence over OJES.
- Decision(s) of the Judge(s) is/are final.

EXHIBITING/PLACING EXHIBITS

- The decision(s) of the AGM Show Chair(s) regarding exhibit queries/placement is binding.
- Exhibitors must be registered for AGM 2017 in order to place exhibits into the Show.
- Exhibitors are allowed one entry per class.
- Exhibitors are requested to fill out an entry tag, unless otherwise stated in the Show Schedule. You may use your Club/Society entry tags. Extra entry tags will be available. Included on the upper portion of the entry tag that remains visible on the show table, are the Section, Class #, Class name, common name (if applicable), & botanical name (if possible). The information on the lower portion of the entry tag should be securely turned under so that the exhibitor's name is not visible. Please include your name & club/society. This information is essential for accurate record keeping of AGM show statistics.
- In order to encourage the "educational" aspect of Shows, it is requested that exhibitors make every
 effort to include proper botanical (Latin) names, in addition to the common name, or name given for
 the Class. There is a good deal of reference material available for this purpose, including nursery
 catalogues, books, tags from purchases etc. The judge(s) look(s) upon labeling /identification
 favourably.
- Containers for specimens shall be provided by the exhibitor; shall be clean and clear glass or plastic.

ENTRY DEADLINES

- Exhibits must be in place and exhibitors must have left the Show Area no later than 9:00 a.m. No late entries will be accepted.
- Judging will begin at 9:30 a.m.





DIVISION I – HORTICULTURE:

Section A Horticultural Specimens

Class 1	Hellebores, any colour, 1 stem
Class 2	Narcissus, any variety, 1 cultivar, 2 stems
Class 3	Tulip, any variety, 1 cultivar, 2 stems
Class 4	any other bulb, corm or rhizome, growth habit under 6", 3 stems
Class 5	any other bulb, corm or rhizome, growth habit 6" and over, 1 stem
Class 6	Narcissus collection in one container, minimum 3 cultivars, 1 stem per cultivar
Class 7	Tulip collection in one container, minimum 3 cultivars, 1 stem per cultivar
Class 8*	Branch with bloom, forced or fresh cut, max. length 76 cm (30")*
Class 9*	Branch showing foliage only, forced or fresh cut, max. length 76 cm (30")*
Class 10	Any other annual or perennial, 2 stems
Class 11	Collection of spring blooms in one container, min. 5 species, 1 stem per species

*Measurement will be taken along the stem from the <u>cut end to the stem tip</u>. No tropicals are permitted.

Section B Container-Grown Plants (OJES page 25-27)

Class 12	Cactus, maximum pot size 6"
Class 13	Saintpaulia (African Violet), 1 crown, max. pot size 6"
Class 14	Any other gesneriad, max. pot size 6"
Class 15	Ferns, maximum pot size 8"
Class 16	Succulents (other than cactus), max. pot size 6"
Class 17	Any other plant grown for foliage, max. pot size 8"
Class 18	Any other flowering plant, max, not size 8"

- ♣ The use of dyed/sprayed **fresh** plant material is prohibited.
- Accessories are allowed.
- If possible, include a photograph of the art work that served as inspiration for this design.

PHOTOGRAPHIC COMPETITION RULES & REGULATIONS

- Photographs must have been taken by the exhibitor within the last 24 months and not previously shown at an AGM.
- One entry per Class per exhibitor is permitted.
- All photographs should incorporate some natural content.
- A Photographs may be colour or black and white.
- A Photographs may be digital or film in origin.
- Actual prints (portion submitted on photographic paper) must be a minimum of 4" X 4" & may not exceed 4"x 6".
- Discretion is advised regarding the inclusion of people & pets in photographs submitted for adjudication.
- ♣ Prints **must** be mounted on a 5" x 7" piece of white cardboard.
- Attach your traditional entry tag to cardboard on the bottom right hand corner and complete with Class #, Title, Name of Exhibitor, and Club/Society.
- ♣ Entries must be picked up at the end of the meeting. Unredeemed entries will not be returned to exhibitors.
